The meeting was called to order by Chairman Rex Vosburg at 9:00 a.m. in the Chambers.

Minutes:

The minutes of the February 21, 2024 meeting were unanimously approved on the motion of Supervisor Pete Walrod and second of Supervisor Michelle Kinville.

District Attorney:

Chief Assistant District Attorney Robert Mascari provided the following updates:

- Mr. Gabor successfully completed another violent felony trial.
- Have seven or eight violent felony cases awaiting trial.
- There are approximately 22 appeals pending.
- Sent out and discussed with the Committee the body worn camera issue that has come up with Axon that they are now trying to bill DA offices to access what was free. The memo that was sent out and shared prior to the Committee meeting explains the process. The matter is being discussed statewide and with state government. The worst case scenario is that it will cost us a total of \$37K for five years. If an agreement is reached by the end of the second

quarter which is June 30th the contract will be effective on January 1, 2025 so that it can be budgeted in next year's budget.

- Found out that one of our Assistant District Attorneys who handles sexual assault cases has been offered and accepted a job at the Attorney General's office; need to replace this position within a month. Another full time assistant may be leaving in September. Looking for guidance from the Chairman, the Board, the County Administrator and Human Resources as to how we are going to compete with recruitment and retention at our present salary levels. Handed out a Madison County DA Adjustments to Salary Proposal for the Committee to review which includes two possible ways to pay for the increase. County Administrator Mark Scimone stated that the process will start with GOC.

Sheriff's Office:

Undersheriff Bill Wilcox presented the following resolution to the Committee:

Emergency Management:

Emergency Management Deputy Director Mike Sudol presented the following resolution to the Committee:

Authorizing the Chairman to Enter Into an Agreement with the Town of Georgetown for Emergency Medical Services

The Committee unanimously approved the resolution on the motion of Kinville and second of Wicks.

Deputy Director of Emergency Management Mike Sudol provided the following updates:

- Budget modification going to Finance, Ways and Means for the Statewide Interoperable Communications Grant.
- Budget modification going to Finance, Ways and Means to move money from the EMS program to Facilities for paper supplies for the ambulance stations.
- April 8 is the Solar Eclipse. The biggest concern will be what happens after with traffic. Will have extra standby crews for the Fire Departments and EMS. Utica also has a big Women's Hockey Championship over the weekend.

Director of EMS Jenna Illingworth provided the following updates:

- So far for the year the ambulance EMS agencies have done 781 emergencies, handled 95% of the call volume at Sullivan and 99% of the call volume at Hamilton, done around 50 calls with the fly car, provided 58 mutual aid calls between both stations, done 76 transfers out of Oneida and Hamilton hospitals and done 16 standbys at Colgate.
- Distributed a letter from Hubbardsville Fire Chief thanking us for the excellent emergency services provided to their fire district.

- Handed out a Proposed Ambulance Replacement Schedule for the Committee to review. Would like to start replacing ambulances around 125,000 miles. We are putting around 25,000 miles a year on the rigs. If we start this year, will have to replace an ambulance once a year going forward. It takes about six months to get an ambulance. Will use ARPA money left for us from last year to begin the process and the shared service monies we might get from Sullivan.

Other Committee Business:

Chairman Rex Vosburg presented the following resolutions to the Committee:

Reappointing Members to the Madison County Traffic Safety Board

The Committee unanimously approved the resolution on the motion of Walrod and second of Wicks.

Placement of Special Patrol Officers within Madison County School Districts that Have a Local Municipal Police Department Available

Committee members reviewed and discussed the proposed resolution. Chairman Pinard made the motion to move the resolution, and due to a lack of a second the resolution was defeated.

AUTHORIZING THE CHAIRMAN TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH NEW YORK STATE OFFICE OF INDIGENT LEGAL SERVICES FOR A THREE-YEAR DISTRIBUTION 2024-2027 (2nd H-H GRANT)

WHEREAS, the County of Madison by Resolution 19-242 dated May 14, 2019, entered into an agreement with the New York State Office of Indigent Legal Services for a Five-Year Distribution for 2018-2023 (H-H Grant); and a one-year extension thereto for 2023-2024 by Resolution 23-162 dated May 9, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Office of Indigent Legal Services and Madison County desire to enter into an agreement for the provision of funds to further assist the County in improving the quality of indigent legal services provided by such County pursuant to Article 18-B of the County Law for a Three-Year Distribution for April 1, 2024 to March 31, 2027; and

WHEREAS, the maximum amount of funds available and payable to the County under this three-year distribution for 2024-2027 shall not exceed \$3,216,078.21; and

WHEREAS, the County shall be reimbursed only for costs actually incurred in accordance with this Agreement. Payments shall be made in arrears on a quarterly basis and shall be processed upon submission by the County and approval by the NYS Office of Indigent Legal Services of appropriate statements and vouchers; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement shall be in effect for the period from April 1, 2024 to March 31, 2027, unless terminated earlier pursuant to its terms; and

WHEREAS, this agreement has been reviewed and approved by the Criminal Justice, Public Safety and Emergency Communications Committee;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors be and is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement on behalf of the County of Madison with the NYS Office of Indigent Legal Services, in the form as is on file with the Clerk of the Board.

WHEREAS, on November 11, 2023, Madison County Emergency Medical Services (MC EMS) began providing emergency medical services to the area formerly serviced by the Southern Madison County Volunteer Ambulance Corps, Inc. which includes Colgate University; and

WHEREAS, Colgate University regularly has events, including athletics and other special events, where it is necessary to have emergency medical services (EMS) on a dedicated stand-by; and

WHEREAS, many Colgate University students trained as EMS providers, and in conjunction with the Max A. Shacknai Center for Outreach, Volunteerism and Education (COVE), are approved to operate as EMS providers for MC EMS; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to this agreement, MC EMS will charge Colgate University an hourly rate of \$40.00 per hour for up to two paid members of MC EMS staff being assigned to Colgate University events; and

WHEREAS, furthermore, MC EMS will not charge Colgate University for any event coverage provided by Colgate University students participating in the COVE program; and

WHEREAS, this agreement has been reviewed and approved by the Criminal Justice, Public Safety and Emergency Communications Committee;

WHEREAS, Southern Madison County Volunteer Ambulance Corps, Inc. (SOMAC) was incorporated as a Not-for-Profit Corporation in June 1986 for the purpose providing emergency medical services to, amongst other areas, the Town of Hamilton; and

WHEREAS, SOMAC ceased operations on November 11, 2023; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Madison County Resolution 22-526, the Madison County Board of Supervisors approved the operation of an Advanced Life Support (ALS) Transporting Service within Madison County known as Madison County EMS; and

WHEREAS, Madison County EMS holds a Municipal Certificate of Need, granted by the New York State Department of Health, for the entirety of Madison County which includes the areas formerly serviced by SOMAC; and

WHEREAS, Madison County EMS has been providing emergency medical services to the areas formerly serviced by SOMAC subsequent to SOMAC's last operational day of November 11, 2023; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate for Madison County EMS to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Town of Hamilton for the purpose of providing emergency medical services to the town commencing January 1, 2024 and ending December 31, 2024; and

WHEREAS, this Memorandum of Understanding has been reviewed and approved by the Criminal Justice, Public Safety and Emergency Communications Committee;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors be and is hereby authorized to sign a Memorandum of Understanding on behalf of the County of Madison with the Town of Hamilton, in the form as is on file with the Clerk of the Board.

**APPROVING AN UPDATE TO THE MADISON COUNTY EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES
MUTUAL AID PLAN**

WHEREAS, the Emergency Medical Service (EMS) Agencies in Madison County share a common goal of providing patients with efficient and high quality pre-hospital care; and

WHEREAS, the Madison County Emergency Medical Services Mutual Aid Plan, required by State EMS Code (800.21.p), is designed to allocate Mutual Aid resources in an efficient, patient oriented manner; and

WHEREAS, through a cooperative effort between the EMS Agencies operating in Madison County and the Madison County Office of Emergency Management, the Madison County Emergency Medical Services Mutual Aid Plan has been updated to reflect changes agreed to by the EMS Agencies; and

WHEREAS, this plan has been reviewed and approved by the Criminal Justice, Public Safety and Emergency Communications Committee;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors be and is hereby authorized to execute the updated Madison County Emergency Medical Services Mutual Aid Plan, in the form as is on file with the Clerk of the Board.

**URGING THE STATE OF NEW YORK TO ENACT THE RESCUE EMS PACKAGE OF
LEGISLATION TO STRENGTHEN EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES**

WHEREAS, Emergency Medical Service (EMS) is a vital resource necessary to the health and well-being of communities across New York; and

WHEREAS, as a system that provides a wide range of pre-hospital medical care to sick or injured people in emergency situations, the difference between a municipality that provides for EMS and one that does not can often make the difference between life and death; and

WHEREAS, despite its vast importance, there is an ongoing EMS crisis in this state, particularly in how it is funded, staffed and operated; and

WHEREAS, much of this stems from a fundamental misconception about EMS vis-a-vis other critical services like police and fire. This is reflected in New York State law, which fails to recognize the essential nature of EMS; and

WHEREAS, as a result, EMS providers are often undervalued and under-respected for the critical role they play in our communities; and

WHEREAS, the EMS framework in New York includes an array of private, public or not-for-profit providers that have expanded across the state in a scattered, patchwork approach leaving many New York residents uncertain whether an EMS provider will be available in their community at the time of need, which is why we need to create greater flexibility for municipalities to facilitate EMS to meet unique local challenges representing a critical next step in the provision of EMS;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Madison County urges the New York State Legislature to support the following legislative measures during the 2024 legislative session:

- **S.4020-C (Mayer) / A.3392-C (Otis)**
This comprehensive legislative package allows special taxing districts to be created to fund EMS services. In addition, this legislation would recognize EMS as an essential service and provide reforms to the Emergency Medical Services Council.
- **S.5000 (May) / A.4077 (Lupardo)**
This legislation would remove EMS services from the real property tax cap, allowing local municipalities to expand and better support their local EMS services. This measure is of critical importance to counties like Erie, Wayne, Otsego, and Wyoming which have established county-operated EMS systems.
- **S.8486-A (Hinchey) / A.9102-A (Kelles)**
This legislation authorizes Medicaid reimbursement to emergency medical service (EMS) agencies for providing Treatment in Place (TIP) to a patient at the point of response; as well as Transportation to an Alternate Provider (TAP), getting a patient to the most appropriate health care setting other than a hospital, such as a mental health clinic, rehabilitation facility or urgent care. This is NOT legislation that will supplement any existing medical services provided by nurses or hospital staff.

- **S.6630 (Mannion) / A..6274 (Barrett)**
This legislation allows volunteer firefighters and ambulance workers to claim both state income and local property tax credits.
- **S.7286 (Martinez) / A.7524 (Thiele) (Part CC, S.8309-A)**
This legislation increases the volunteer firefighters' and ambulance workers' personal income tax credit from \$200 to \$800 for eligible individuals and from \$400 to \$1,600 for eligible married joint filers. This legislation also allows volunteer firefighters and ambulance workers to claim both state income and local property tax credits.
- **S.3223 (Sanders) / A.9237 (Hevesi)**
This bill would create a methodology for ambulance reimbursement under Medicaid that more closely approximates the cost of providing the service. Ambulances are required by law to pick everyone up, including Medicaid patients. It is unfair to require these ambulance companies to accept Medicaid patients and then not fairly reimburse them for the costs of providing services to these patients.
- **S.6645 (Comrie) / A.6136 (Eachus)**
This legislation requires the Thruway Authority to issue emergency services permits to EMS vehicles as is already done for fire vehicles, which would exempt EMS from being required to pay tolls while transporting patients on the NYS Thruway.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Madison County shall forward copies of this resolution to Governor Kathy C. Hochul, the New York State Legislature, the New York State Association of Counties and all others deemed necessary and proper.
